About Assemble

Assemble is a collaborative work between Level 3 students on the dance and music programmes at West Thames College. In this project, musicians and dancers were asked to create songs and choreographies based on themes, styles and concepts that were interesting to them. Additional choreography and motifs came from artists Becky Namgauds & tyroneisaacstuart and course leaders Jasmine Andrews & Jake Briggs. The content created from the students was then curated in the space by the Lead Artists. Becky Namgauds

Becky Namgauds is a choreographer and dance artist creating intense, powerful work. Inspired by personal and political issues, her work is female-driven and internationally influenced. Namgauds has created dance for theatres, outdoor festivals and film. In the past she has collaborated with Hofesh Shechter Company and LIFT, Arbonauts and Scarabeus Aerial Theatre. Her show *Like Honey* was part of the British Council Edinburgh Showcase 2019, and her solo *Exhibit F* premiered at Dance Umbrella 2019, touring in early 2020. Her outdoor work *Rodadoras*, performed by three dancers in half a tonne of soil is performed nationally and internationally.

tyroneisaacstuart

tyroneisaacstuart is an interdisciplinary, artist whose skills originate from Jazz and Hip-Hop Theater. He was educated by the Tomorrow's Warriors Jazz organization & multiaward-winning Boy Blue Entertainment. From there he went on to achieve a BA in Jazz Saxophone. With over 12 years of professional working experience as a performer across dance and music, his dance practice has grown to become a mixture of Krump (a street dance), contemporary dance, visual art & Jazz music. He has worked with established artists within Hip hop (Joseph Toonga, Theo Godson, Botis Seva), contemporary dance (Irene Wernli, Hofesh Shechter Company & Nora Chipaumire) & Jazz (Soweto Kinch, Moses Boyd, Theon Cross, Cassie Kinoshi & Kokorocko). He is a Steve Reid Innovation Award 2019-2020 recipient, and a 2020 Artist in Residence at Clarence Mews Space, and a 2021 East London Ideas Fund awardee.

A note from the choreographer

With the creation of *Extra Time* we were much more interested in a process than a product. I've been working with footballers in dance contexts for the last 10 years and the hardest thing until today is finding footballers who are ready to jump into the unknown.

Extra Time was a chance to meet a new community of footballers in London and a chance to begin a collaboration which could extend beyond this one presentation, and thus, despite the trying circumstances of having to communicate with a new group via online video streams, it was a chance I couldn't say no to.

What we are creating is an attempt at seeing how different football bodies interact with material and aesthetics which I have built up over the years and how we can take this further.

Ahilan Ratnamohan

Ahilan Ratnamohan is a performance-maker working with non-classically trained performers to create cross-disciplinary pieces. He is inspired above all by sport and language-learning processes. In his early twenties Ahil attempted to make a career as a professional footballer spending time in the Netherlands, Germany and Sweden. He began concentrating on contemporary performance in 2007, collaborating with a range of companies in Sydney, most extensively with Urban Theatre Projects, Branch Nebula and Martin del Amo.

Since 2012 he has been based in Antwerp, where he began to lead his own projects. His work is disparate and straddles many different themes and aesthetics. In the last 10 years his work has developed into three trajectories; the choreographic investigation of football; language learning as performance and; his collaboration with the Star Boy Collective, the performance troupe which grew organically out of his first production, *Michael Essien I want to play as you...* Since 2020 Ahilan is a member of the collectively, autonomous production house Robin vzw.
